

The above performance figures show the West Lancashire CSP area has the fourth lowest crime figures across the LCC area.

Over the last eight calendar years, crime trends are similar across all districts within the Lancashire Force Area with a peak recorded during 2018. Crimes across Lancashire showed a decrease trend following 2018 into 2020, 2021 subsequently recorded increases across the districts.


2022 recorded increases across both West and South districts, with East remaining relatively the same compared to 2021, although all remain below the figures recorded during 2018. From 2022 all districts have seen a decline in crimes in 2023 and then again 2024.

All Crime West Lancashire




Following a peak of 653 recorded offences in March 2018, the overall trend since then to 2023 has been downward one. In 2024 this trend line starts on an incline. In 2024 there were 6067 recorded crimes, this is an increase of 7% when compared to the previous year which had 5656 recorded crimes.

ASB On Mischief Night (30th October)



The trendline reveals a significant reduction in ASB since the introduction of Bright Sparx and Go4IT. In 2024 there were 13 ASB incidents recorded on Mischief Night, this is a decline from the same night in 2023 which had 14 ASB incidents in West Lancashire.

Criminal Damage & Arson



Criminal Damage and Arson offences have been sporadic over the last six calendar years, recording an overall downward trend. Arson and Criminal damage have declined by 5% when comparing 2024 (n=646) to 2023 (n=677). Arson and Criminal damage figures accounts for 11% of all crime in 2024.






Violence against the person trendline remains static with very little change over the 6-year period. During 2024 the monthly totals have stayed relatively consistent (range n=202-242).


In 2024 there were 2704 violence against the person records, compared to 2023 there were 2515 this is an increase of 8%. Overall, violence against the person offences accounted for 45% of crime overall in West Lancs in 2024.

Vehicle Crime



Recorded vehicle crime has been highly sporadic over the last six calendar years, however, overall reveals a downward trend.


There is a total of 309 vehicle crimes in 2024. This is a decline when compared to the previous year of 22%, as 2023 had 394 recorded vehicle crimes. In 2023 Vehicle crime peaked in August 2023 with 57 Vehicle crimes, since then it has been on a downward trend.



Over the last six calendar years a downward trend is observed for burglary offences. In 2024 there were 376 burglary crimes recorded; this is a 3% decline from 2023 which had 387 burglary crimes. Residential burglaries (n=196) account for just over half of these.

Deliberate Fires

There has been a downward trend till 2023 with the lowest number of deliberate fires recorded at 6. In 2024 this has nearly tripled with 17 fires recorded in October and November.
